

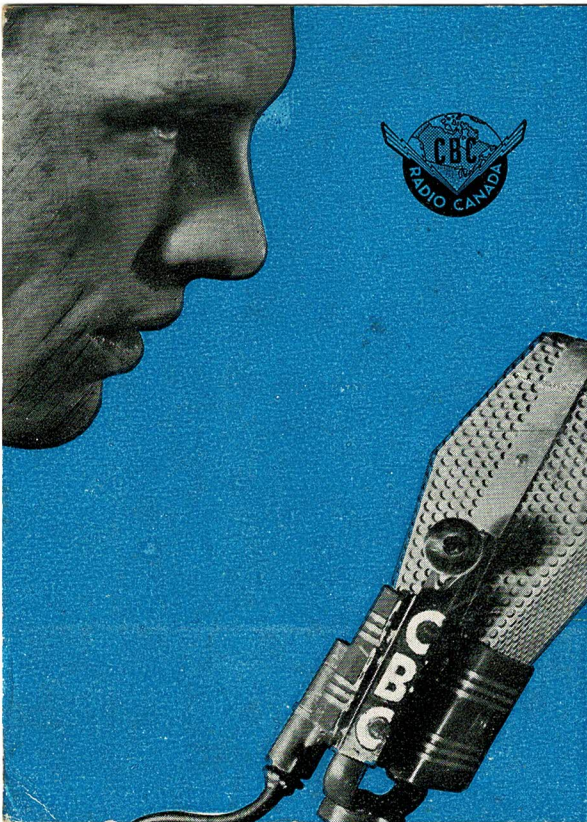

6.45 to 8 p.m. in Eastern Australia
8.45 to 10 p.m. in New Zealand

Frequencies

Station CHOL 25.60 meters or 11.72 megacycles per second
Station CHLS 31.22 meters or 9.61 megacycles per second

(Listeners will be advised on the air or by mail of any changes in frequency.)

Programs

All programs are produced by the Australian, New Zealand and South Pacific Unit of the CBC International Service. They are designed to tell listeners about Canadian life and to present an up-to-the-minute picture of happenings in Canada.

Regular Features

Canadian Chronicle—Pacific Edition: A weekly roundup of events in Canada told by eye-witness reporters in all parts of the country.

News: Canadian and international.

Sunday Evening Concert: Popular and classical music by Canadian and international artists.
