Dear Listener:

I thought you'd like to know, that starting on Sunday September 17, there'll be a change of broadcasting hours on our regular Pacific Transmission which will affect our sign-on time for a period of six weeks.

The new starting time on September 17 will be 0540 GMT (3.40 PM in Eastern Australia; 5.40 PM in New Zealand and Fiji).

However, there'll be no change of frequencies. We'll continue to broadcast on the same stations as at present——CHOL, 25.60 meters (11.72 megacycles) and CKLO, 31.15 meters (9.63 megacycles).

This temporary adjustment in our service results from the fact that our telegraphic lines to our transmitter are in need of overhaul, and as it happens, the most suitable time for repair-work falls in the Sunday period usually occupied by our Pacific Transmissions. However, the adjustment is only temporary. Beginning October 29, we'll be back to our regular sign-on time——0840 GMT (6.40 PM in Eastern Australia; 8.40 PM in New Zealand and Fiji).

I'm sorry we have to inconvenience you in this way, but I feel sure you'll understand how unavoidable it is.
